## Past Board Member Spotlight Jennifer Puntenney

Jennifer retired from the WNHA Board last spring after devoting fifteen years to our mission. We were sorry to see her go and will miss her insights and contributions, but we are delighted to report that she is continuing her job as the purchaser of books in our gift shop.

During her time on the Board, she co-chaired and later chaired all of the special events put on by the Association. These included the Maple Sugar Festival, the annual meetings, and other programs and events. Twelve years ago she became our gift shop book buyer and is responsible for the exceptional variety of nature-themed books available. The native plant garden in front of the building was designed and planted by a 4-H group under the supervision of Jennifer and Carol Strahler.



Whenever special projects came up, we could always count on her to volunteer her time.
